



- The East Asian-Australasian Flyway -

The East Asian-Australasian Flyway is among the most important migratory routes for birds in the world. Many birds migrating along the EAAF breed in the arctic, boreal and temperate parts of Asia. As winter arrives, millions of birds leave their breeding grounds and fly towards to warmer parts of Asia (including Singapore) and Australia. More than 550 species of birds migrate along the EAAF, including various hawks, shorebirds, warblers, cranes and flycatchers. Over 100 of these migratory bird species can pass by, or spend their winters in Singapore.

The journey of these migratory birds are however not easy, and are fraught with numerous dangers along the way...
