

### 1.7 Outcome - What is the outcome from your event?

An agreement was made with BKSDA to direct the local government's plan about making the coastal area of Desa Sungai Cemara become a tourist site based on education and ecotourism, so it will not disturb birds, migratory birds, and other biota there.

In March 2017, there was a case when a hundred migratory bird had paralysis of their legs and wings so they could not fly for food. Species that have experienced paralysis is *Calidris tenuirostris*. 75 of the 100 birds eventually died, and the remaining 25 have been rescued by local people. One of 25 surviving birds was taken to the laboratory as a sample. The results obtained that the cause of the paralysis was likely due to pathogenic bacteria, i.e. *E. coli* and *Bacillus sp.*

We educated local people on how to manage the wetland area (migratory bird habitat), and how to handle the injured birds if a similar case happens again.

Based on observation, we recorded 25 species during 4 days of data retrieval. Of the 25 species, 11 species were migratory birds and the remainder were residential. The most abundant species was *Charadrius mongolus*.

Our activities were covered by local media, namely 'tribun jambi' and published on 15 May 2017. (the publication is attached).

BKSDA and Local Government's concern about coastal area in Desa Sungai Cemara increased with the occurrence of migratory bird paralysis in March 2017. With our presence and this WMBD event in Jambi, BKSDA got additional data, and we can give them additional input for coastal management in Desa Sungai Cemara.

*Villagers share about the case in March 2017, when a hundred of Calidris tenuirostris are paralyzed and how they nurse the injured bird.*

*We shared the information about how important migratory birds are for the environment, how to preserve the habitat of migratory birds (especially shorebirds and waterbirds), and how to easily monitor the quality of the habitat. We also gave them the information and standard operational procedure if the same case happens again.*

#### **Section 4. SHORT SUMMARY REPORT (Compulsory)**

This WMBD event was held at Desa Sungai Cemara-Jambi. One of the reasons why this location was chosen is because of the information from headman of Desa Sungai Cemara about an unfortunate incident that occurred in March 2017. A hundred little stint were paralyzed on Pantai Cemara – Desa Sungai Cemara Jambi. Only 7 birds survived and were able to fly back to their habitat. Related to that incident, with this WMBD event we approached the local conservation and natural resource agency (BKSDA) and the local government to conduct migratory bird monitoring and socialization to local people at Desa Sungai Cemara about how to maintain and manage the habitat, and how to handle the birds in the event of a similar incident occurring again. During the discussion with BKSDA, BKSDA also conveyed the local government's plan to make Pantai Cemara-Desa Sungai Cemara into a tourist location. With some discussion related to the availability of the migratory bird habitat, we the formulated some rules and points that should be considered by the local government for their plan. During the monitoring and survey event, we recorded 25 species, 11 of which were migratory birds. Lesser Sand Plover was the most common sighting. Based on monitoring and observation results, Pantai Cemara is one of the important habitats for migratory birds in Indonesia. The people also have a great desire to preserve the habitat for the migratory birds that live there, but unfortunately their knowledge is minimal. So, through the WMBD event, we provided information and knowledge to the people in the village, and we linked BKSDA experts to the headman of Desa Sungai Cemara, so that in the future the headman of Desa Sungai Cemara can communicate directly with BKSDA.
