

This year, BioTa will take action and participate in celebrating World Migratory Bird Day 2017 by organizing various events that will be described below. As WMBD this year's theme, "Their Future is Our Future" with an emphasis on the topic of "sustainable development for wildlife and humans", BioTa, through these event, will targeting all relevant stakeholders particularly the decision makers in the implementation of development, especially in Gorontalo. In addition, community groups, universities, NGOs, and students will be encouraging in participate on 2017 WMBD event. The awareness-rising campaign will aim at raising public awareness and highlighting the need for the protection of migratory birds and their habitats.

The Limboto Lake which is the greater lake in the province of Gorontalo and located in the middle of the region (0°33'0.35" - 0°47'0.49" N and 122°42'0.24" - 123°03'1.17" E) is one of the most important habitat for migratory waterbirds in Indonesia, the Limboto Lake in the last three years became very popular among birdwatcher and photographers, which are visiting this place and start documenting and monitoring different species of birds. The lake supports 85 species of birds including 49 species of migratory birds, such as stilt, bee-eaters, Pacific Golden Plover, Pintail Snipe, Asian Dowitcher, Curlew sandpiper, and Red-necked Stint.

Over the week of 10 May, BioTa will take action and organize public events such as birdwatching, educational activities, bird photo hunting and photo exhibition.

Birdwatching

Birdwatching activities will be held on 6 May 2017. Participants will start birding together by early morning (07:00-09:00) in one of observation spot at Lake Limboto. Birdwatching will be led by experienced birder from BioTa and Burung Indonesia, an NGO. Along with that, bird photo hunting will also be arranged at the same spot and that would involve of the photography groups in Gorontalo. Youth and students from universities will be encouraged to

participate.

Through this activity, it is expected that a minimum of 50 participants from students, nature lovers, and youth groups as well as the photography communities in Gorontalo involved in observing bird migration phenomena at Limboto Lake.

School visit

In the day of 6 May 2017, after having birdwatching in early morning, we will continue by visiting schools (secondary school and high school) in the area, giving presentation on birds migrating over Limboto Lake and distributing WMBD posters and stickers to students. The winning video in the WMBD trailer competition 2016 will be played. The video will show the place chosen for the video-making was the Limboto Lake. Quiz and games related birds will also be played. We are expecting to have 70 pupils and teachers participate on this event.

Migratory Birds Photo Exhibition

This year, in celebrating the 2017 WMBD, BioTa will hold photo exhibition themed “Burung migran: masa depan mereka, masa depan kita juga”. The photo exhibition will take place along the week of 10 May 2017 at the Government Office of Gorontalo Regency, publicly accessible and center for the government activity. In addition, administratively, the Limboto Lake located in the area of Gorontalo Regency.

Variety of awareness materials related to bird migration will be displayed including: 30 selected photos of migratory birds species and their habitat of Limboto Lake, maps of bird migration flyway, 2017 WMBD posters. The winning video in the WMBD trailer competition 2016 will also be played during the exhibition.

At least, 250 participants are expected to participate and enliven the first ever wildlife photo exhibition especially bird migration that been held in Gorontalo, which where the participants come from photography communities, youth and students, public in general, and especially the government staffs of Gorontalo Regency.

All the above activities will be covered by media including Newspaper, Online news, TV, radio, and social media such as Facebook, blogs, twitter and instagram. The major aim for the event is to raise awareness on the

conservation of migratory birds and their habitats to the public and decision markers.

Indonesia. The member of BioTa coming from a wide-range background such as: conservationists, journalist, business, and academician, and all are lives in Gorontalo. The main goal of the organisation is to promote the conservation of biodiversity through research and monitoring, conservation campaign and education, and conservation policy.

This year, BioTa will take action and participate on the World Migratory Bird Day 2017 event in Gorontalo - Indonesia. The main objective of the event is to raise public awareness on migratory bird and their conservation action especially on protecting their habitat - Limboto Lake, one of the most important stopover habitats for migratory birds in Gorontalo. We plan to have birdwatching at Limboto Lake early in the morning, and afterwards, educational activity at secondary and high schools near by the Limboto Lake. Photo exhibition on migratory birds will be conducted along the week of 10 May 2017 at government office of Gorontalo Regency, a public accessible and center for government activity. Vary of awareness materials on migratory birds such as posters, banners, maps, and photos will be produced and presented. Video on World Migratory Bird Day - Official Trailer and the winner of WMBD video contest 2016 will also be played during the exhibition.

We will encourage people in Gorontalo including students, local government, academician, birdwatchers, photographers, and community groups especially who live around the lake to take action and participate on the 2017 WMBD event. All the above activities will be covered by media including Newspaper, Online news, TV, radio, and

	social media such as facebook, blogs, twitter and instagram. We are expecting to have 400 participants from all targeted participants involved on this 2017 WMBD event. BioTa will make every effort to get local pride on migratory birds and bird conservation in general.
