1. Introduction:

The Small Grant for 2018 [World Migratory Bird Day](#) (WMBD) has been established to provide financial support to [EAAFP Partners](#) and collaborators from [EAAFP Task Forces and Working Groups](#) who plan to organize **public events and/or conservation action-oriented workshops** at national or local levels through participating in the World Migratory Bird Day. We strongly encourage EAAFP Partners and collaborators to make an application for any suitable event or development of WMBD materials in local language that aims to raise awareness on the need of conserving migratory water birds and the value of their habitats in East Asian – Australasian Flyway.

2. Eligibility Criteria:

EAAFP Partners who plan to organize an event to celebrate 2018 World Migratory Bird Day in the following countries: **Bangladesh, Cambodia, Indonesia, Mongolia, Myanmar, Philippines, Thailand and Viet Nam** are eligible to apply. (If you are not sure, please see [the list of EAAFP Partners](#)).

If you are not the country focal point of EAAFP, please consult and plan with EAAFP focal point of your country before you apply.

Please note that this grant is to initiate a WMBD event, not to cover the costs for the existing WMBD event expenses. Applications with similar contents (location, target participants etc.) from the previous years may not be accepted.

Note:

This form must be filled by an applicant organization only if applicant or applicant organization qualifies the eligibility criteria set for funding assistance under 2018 EAAFP WMBD Small Grants Programme.

For your budget planning, please note that approximately total 1,000 USD will be allocated to each county. The small-scale grant will be allocated on a first come first served basis, we recommend you submit the application as early as possible.

The deadline for application is **18 April 2018**. Please submit an application to Ms. Hyeseon Do, Programme Officer via email (Word or PDF document) at programme@eaaflyway.net and wmbd@eaaflyway.net.

After receipt of your application, the Secretariat will review it and then inform you of the result of your application within one or two weeks. Incomplete applications will not be processed further.

Many countries around the world have been celebrating World Migratory Bird Day (WMBD) since 2006 with the purpose of raising public awareness of the need for the conservation of migratory birds and their habitats. Each year, on the second weekend in May, people around the world take actions and organize public events such as bird festivals, education programs, exhibitions and bird-watching excursions to celebrate WMBD.

Since 2010, Mongolian Ornithological Society (MOS) has been celebrating the event WMBD Mongolia. This was only one organization that supported the event for Mongolia. Since this event began in Mongolia, MOS has been continually financing and organizing this event in Mongolia.

This year, we are holding the event in Ulaanbaatar on 12th-13th May, in collaboration with Ministry of Environment and Tourism, National University of Mongolia along with many other organizations. Before the event we will visit 2-3 schools in Ulaanbaatar and give introduction talks to the 8-9th grade children and officially announce the art competition 'Migratory Birds' among them. The winners of the competition will be awarded during the official event which will be held at the Freshwater Resources and Nature Conservation Center, and the best artworks will be exhibited there.

The event include bird walks, bird talks, bird race, exhibition of children's artworks, and documentary film watches. The bird watching in the field takes to the Nagoon Lake in the western part of Ulaanbaatar city.

Expected outcome:

- Raised awareness among participants on the conservation, biology, and ecology of migratory birds and their habitats.
- Added the number of participants such as school children, teachers, and parents, to the previous years.
- Enhanced the relationship between policy makers and conservation biologists and ornithologists. Yet, the strengthened the friendship between the hardcore birders and the amateur bird and wildlife enthusiasts.
- Replenished the passion and love of school children for wildlife and their conservation, through their artworks, given lectures, and field bird watching experience.
- The event will introduce activities and actions of EAAFP to all participants.
