## About World Migratory Bird Day 2020

The 2020 theme of World Migratory Bird Day (WMBD) is " Birds Connect Our World", and was chosen to highlight the importance of conserving and restoring the ecological connectivity and integrity of ecosystems that support the natural movements of migratory birds and that are essential for their survival and well-being. WMBD is an annual awareness-raising campaign highlighting the need for the conservation of migratory birds and their habitats. It has a global outreach and is an effective tool to help raise global awareness of the threats faced by migratory birds, their ecological importance, and the need for international cooperation to conserve them. In 2018, WMBD unified the planet's major migratory bird corridors, or flyways: the African-Eurasian flyway, the East Asian-Australasian flyway, and the Americas flyways. **WMBD is now celebrated twice a year, on the Second Saturday in May and in October. In 2020, WMBD will be held on 9 May and 10 October.** The EAAFP Secretariat encourages Partners to celebrate WMBD twice a year.

## Introduction of EAAFP WMBD 2020 Small Grant

The Small Grant for 2020 [World Migratory Bird Day](#) (WMBD) has been established to provide financial support to [EAAFP Partners](#) and collaborators from [EAAFP Task Forces and Working Groups](#) who plan to organize **public events and/or conservation action-oriented workshops** at national or local levels through participating in the World Migratory Bird Day. We strongly encourage EAAFP Partners and collaborators to make an application for any suitable event or development of WMBD materials in local language that aims to raise awareness on the need of conserving migratory waterbirds and the value of their habitats in East Asian – Australasian Flyway.

## Eligibility Criteria

EAAFP Partners who plan to organize an event to celebrate World Migratory Bird Day 2020 in Partner countries included in the DAC list of ODA Recipients are our priority to support. (If you are not sure, please see the [list of EAAFP Partners](#), and [DAC list of ODA Recipients](#)). If you are not the country focal point of EAAFP, please consult and plan with EAAFP focal point of your country before you apply.

Please note that this grant is to initiate a WMBD event, not to cover the costs for the existing WMBD event expenses. Applications with similar contents (location, target participants etc.) to previous years may not be accepted.

\*Due to COVID-19, we encouraged applicants to carry out activities which prevent face-to-face activities to reduce risk of spreading COVID-19. All activities organization has to follow

national guidelines of the country to prevent COVID-19. We also encourage proposals to promote Flyway Network Sites for the WMBD activities.

### **Information of the application**

Firstly, Applicants must meet the eligibility criteria set for funding assistance under EAAFP WMBD 2020 Small Grants Programme.

For your budget planning, please note a maximum of 1,000 USD will be allocated to each county. The small-scale grant will be allocated on a first come first served basis, we recommend you submit the application as early as possible.

After the Secretariat receives your application, the approval of successful proposals is made by the Secretariat. Applicant will hear of the result within two weeks after the deadline. Incomplete applications will not be accepted.

Introduce us from HIMPUS (Poultry Lovers Student Association) which is a student activity unit from the veterinary faculty of Kuala Shia University, Banda Aceh. HIMPUS has been celebrating World Migratory Bird Day in Indonesia since 2016 with community awareness activities to protect migratory birds and their habitats.

This year HIMPUS will again celebrate World Migratory Bird Day 2020 with the theme "Birds Connect Our World". Even though during the current COVID-19 pandemic the enthusiasm of HIMPUS isn't lost to continue to educate the public in guarding migratory bird species and their habitats in Indonesia. however this year this activity avoids direct contact and crowds of people in an effort to tackle COVID-19. Therefore we took the initiative to hold online activities with the same goal. Celebration of World Migratory Bird Day 2020 in Indonesia will carry out activities such as:

**1. World Migratory Bird Day Painting Competition**

This competition will be filled with 3 age categories, namely: category A for children aged 5-12 years, Category B for children aged 13-16 years and Category C for teenagers 17-20 years. This painting competition is conducted online by sending their work to the committee for an assessment of each category. The winners from each category will get a merchandise prize and an award certificate which will be sent to the address of each winner.

**2. World Migratory Bird Day 2020 Webinar with the theme "Birds Connect Our World"**

This webinar is in welcoming the celebration of World Migratory Bird Day 2020 in October. The material will also be presented by speakers who are experienced in the world of bird migration in Indonesia and also involving national parties associated with migratory bird species. WMBD 2020 webinar topic of discussion is the introduction of endemic species of migratory birds in every region of Indonesia, the threat of migratory birds in the wild, and share the source during the observation.

**3. A Short Video about Migratory Birds**

This short video will be shared on Facebook, YouTube and other social media. This short video is a form of distance socialization and education for people who were unable to join in some of the previous activities.

**Expected Outcomes:**

1. Educate the public to protect migratory bird species and habitats in Indonesia.
2. Cultivate a sense of awareness and foster a love of the environment from an early age.
3. Will trigger more activities for nature preservation especially to preserve the life of birds.
4. Establishing connectivity among birdwatchers and environment.
5. The participants gained knowledge and experience of migratory bird conservation.
