Title: Conservation of Wildlife Migratory Bird and Wetland Areas in Misamis Occidental, Philippines through Advocacy and Capacity Development

Date : May 8, 2021

Location: Coastal barangays in the Misamis Occidental, Philippines

Wildlife Migratory Bird is the protected species under international convention (Bonn Convention, 2017). This bi-annual celebration of the World Wildlife Migratory Day aims to raise the level of awareness for conservation and protection of these species. The Philippines is one of the flyway of the wildlife migratory birds in the East Asian-Australasian flyway where important species of birds rest and feed in the healthy wetland areas of the Philippines before they will return to their place of origin. For this year, the Misamis University, Philippines in cooperation of the Department of Environment and Natural Resources Provincial Environment and Natural Resources Office, Misamis Occidental, Philippines will host the event. The event aims to capacitate the Sangguniang Kabataan (SK) Chairmen of the coastal barangays in Misamis Occidental as ambassadors and ambassadors of their respective areas to conserve and protect wildlife migratory birds. The objective of this event is aligned with RA 10742 where Sangguniang Kabataan members are mandated to participate in activities related to conservation, protection and management of the environment.

The activities include awareness on wildlife migratory birds and its importance, lecture workshop on its protection and conservation, development and installation of signage and posters as IEC campaign materials, coastal clean up and bird watching in one of the wetland areas in Misamis Occidental. Twenty five (25) Sangguniang Kabataan Chairmen from the coastal barangays in Misamis Occidental will be invited to attend the training and workshop to be held near the identified focus wetland area in Misamis Occidental. Two days will be allocated to conduct the activities. Training and workshop will be held on Day 1 while bird watching will be simultaneous with the clean up on Day 2. The organizing team will ensure the safety of the participants by imposing strict compliance with the COVID 19 health protocols. Output of this activity will be the Action Plan by the SK Chairmen to conduct information dissemination about wildlife migratory birds and its importance, formulate barangay ordinances to protect migratory birds in their respective areas.

The developed IEC materials will be posted in the strategic locations of coastal barangays in the province. Flyway Network Sites for the WMBD activities will be used as one of the references for the training and workshop and will be featured in the printed IEC materials. After the conduct of the activities, monitoring and evaluation will be conducted by the implementing organization and the report will be posted in the website of Misamis University and Department of Environment and Natural Resources.
