Training for Coastal Women in Protecting Shorebirds Migratory Habitat from Environmental Pollution

1. Objectives:	<p>The aims of this project are:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. increase the number of coastal women who understand and have capacity in migratory waterbird conservation through conservation training; Coastal women are a group of people who live around migratory bird habitats, with the aim of being the main pioneers of conservation Shorebirds Migratory 2. Reducing the level of contamination of Shorebirds Migratory habitat through 3R (Reduce, Reuse, Recycle) training and seminars 3. Local community-based environmental pollution investigations; Coastal women have a vital role in overcoming Shorebirds Migratory habitat pollution 4. Increase local community awareness of the importance of the role of Shorebirds Migratory through the introduction of the concept of ecotourism, so that it becomes another option to increase the economy of coastal women and reduce the unemployment rate of coastal communities
2. Background:	<p>The coastal and marine areas of the Banda Aceh City, Indonesia are very vulnerable to various pollution threats, both from domestic human activities (marine debris), industry (fisheries processing), sea transportation such as oil spills, as well as pollution from congenital waste from various locations. Pollution of the marine environment, namely the introduction by humans, directly or indirectly into the marine environment which results in adverse impacts such as damage to the sustainability of marine life so that it is harmful to the health of marine biota and other animals (Aini D.C. 2021).</p> <p>One of the animals that is very dependent on the coastal area of Banda Aceh City is the Migratory Shorebirds, pollution of the coastal area will certainly have a negative impact on ecosystems, habitats, food and a decrease in the quality of the coastal environment (Alikodra, 2021). If the threat of pollution is not handled properly, it can result in an increasingly widespread negative impact on the lives of the Shorebirds Migratory and the health of the local community (Azlan & Abd Rahman, 2020). The Indonesian government has issued PP No.19 of 1999 concerning Control of Marine Pollution and Destruction. The government regulates the mechanism for reducing marine pollution, including the formation of a National Coordinating Team for handling waste at sea (KKP, 2020).</p> <p>Various city government parties have made efforts to overcome and control pollution in the coastal city of Banda Aceh, but it is still sectoral and not yet integrated. Pollution control in coastal and marine areas cannot be carried out partially and must involve many parties in it. One group that has an important role in preventing pollution is women (Fatimah, S.R, 2021). On this issue, women play an important role in developing production and consumption patterns that are environmentally friendly, thus causing the important role of women in participating in the management of natural resources and the environment.</p> <p>Based on the results of a survey we conducted in 2021, the role of women in preventing pollution of the coastal areas of Banda Aceh City is still very minimal, this is because this activity is still dominated by men, even though women have unique knowledge and responsibilities in sustainable use and conservation of diversity. life, and women are agents of transformational change (UNEP WCMC, 2020). In addition, the understanding of coastal women's groups in Banda Aceh City regarding Shorebirds Migratory conservation is still very low, and even the role of conservation assistants at the village or village level is also not very large. In fact, Banda Aceh City has dozens of villages and hamlets located in the vicinity of mangrove forests or the coast that need assistance in the conservation of migratory bird species. And because women's assistance is also needed because they have different perspectives on animal and environmental conservation.</p> <p>The majority of women from the coast of Banda Aceh depend on their livelihoods as collectors and sellers of shellfish, crabs, oysters and collectors of leftovers. The potential for the existence of Shorebirds Migratory habitat around their area is a gift in itself, because with proper management, there will be a potential for increasing the ecotourism-based community economy, thus increasing the number of coastal villages that are more independent in their communities. Therefore, this research program will encourage women to be more willing to be involved in assistance for Shorebirds Migratory conservation with the community and to be able to work in difficult environments. The aim is to open a new understanding of local communities in managing mangrove forests, migratory bird conservation, and other thoughts from women that so far have not been revealed regarding conservation.</p>
3. Project plan, timeline and methods:	<p>Project Plan and Methods:</p> <p>This activity will be carried out in May – October 2023, at the peak of the migration season in Banda Aceh City, Aceh Province. Activities will include seminars and training, for seminars will be filled by women who have had long experience in conservation, carrying out various social</p>

activities. While the training activities will be led by Tedi Wahyudi for Shorebirds Conservation material. The seminar will be held for 1 or 2 days, depending on the permits obtained later. After the seminar, there will be 5 days of training at Ulee Lheu Beach and Syiah Kuala Beach, Banda Aceh City. The number of participants will be limited and focused on women to ensure that everyone receives optimal training. Training equipment will be provided by KSLH Aceh and Research Center for Elephant Conservation and Biodiversity Forest (PKGB) University of Syiah Kuala Banda Aceh.

- August 2023 : Training for women's groups in Shorebirds Migratory Conservation
- September 2023 : Shorebird species festival (School-University) – World Migratory Bird Day – Women International Day.
- October 2023 : Final Report, Publication in EAAF's newsletter

4. Likely benefit to the conservation of migratory waterbirds and their habitat / or key research outputs:

- Based on the EAAF Strategic Plan 2019 – 2028, this activity will support 6 key result areas.
- a. KRA 1.5 Partners and local stakeholders are engaged in responding to activities which may threaten Flyway Network sites. Threats for migratory waterbirds and their habitat is one on the cackground why we propose this project, and to diliver this project we will collaborate and engaging with local stakeholders.
 - b. KRA 3.1 National monitoring systems to assess the status of migratory waterbirds and their habitats are established, maintained and further enhanced. The seminar attended by multiple stakeholders (University, NGO, Government) is expected to aimed to enhance the flyways monitoring activities on a bigger scale, build a better knowledge, and promote a comprehensive exchange of information concerning waterbirds and their habitat.
 - c. KRA 2.1 The achievement of the elements in the EAAF CEPA Action Plan (2019- 2024). Same as CEPA Vision, our goal is to Instill stewardship of migratory waterbirds conservation and their habitat.

Meanwhile for other equipment such as tents, sleeping bags, GPS, handie talkies, generators will be provided by the University of Syiah Kuala through cooperation. Consumable items will cover all activity participants during the implementation of the activity. Travel and accommodation facilitates all participants to reach activity locations in the city of Banda Aceh. Computing & clerical such as preparing registration documents, certificates, training modules, identification modules. We also use the funds for scientific publications and publication of a pocket book on shorebirds species. We will also try to allocate funds from the gampong, considering that several gampongs in Banda Aceh City have allocated funds for preventing pollution of the surrounding environment. And even if these costs cannot be allocated, funding from EAAFP is optimal for program success.
