The World Migratory Bird Day event at PAUD (Early Childhood Education) Cut Nyak Dhien Mibo Banda Aceh City, themed "Protect Insect Protect Bird," aims to raise environmental awareness, specifically about the importance of protecting insects and birds for the ecosystem. PAUD, which stands for *Pendidikan Anak Usia Dini* (Early Childhood Education School), focuses on the development of young children, providing a critical foundation for their cognitive, social, and emotional growth. This event is also designed to encourage children's creativity through engaging educational activities, while involving the community, including parents and teachers, in a joint effort to support environmental conservation. Additionally, the event offers students an opportunity to showcase their artistic creations, enhancing their confidence and understanding of the natural world.

The event will begin with a public awareness session where the theme of World Migratory Bird Day will be introduced by teachers and environmental advocates. The session will highlight the role of insects and birds in maintaining ecological balance in a simple and engaging manner. Following this, children will participate in a coloring competition with a focus on birds and insects. This activity is intended to stimulate their creativity while visually introducing them to various species.

Next, the children will engage in a drawing competition where they can express their imagination about birds and insects. This competition is designed to help children develop fine motor skills while deepening their understanding of the natural world. The highlight of the event will be a festival showcasing the students' artwork from the coloring and drawing competitions.

This exhibition will be open to parents, teachers, and local community members, providing an opportunity to celebrate the children's hard work. Additionally, there will be a closing ceremony where all participants will make a collective pledge to protect insects and birds, followed by the distribution of certificates and small tokens of appreciation. With this comprehensive event plan, it is hoped that children will not only learn about the importance of environmental conservation but also feel actively involved and motivated to care for the nature around them.

Objectives

1. Increase Environmental Awareness: Educate children and the local community about the importance of protecting insects and birds, and understanding their vital roles in the ecosystem. The goal is to instill early conservation values in young children.
2. Encourage Creativity in Children: Use art as a medium to teach children about birds and insects. Through coloring and drawing competitions, children can express their imagination and deepen their understanding of these species.
3. Engage the Community: Involve parents, teachers, and the local community in educational activities, fostering a shared sense of responsibility for environmental conservation.

- Celebrate Student Achievements: Provide a platform for students to showcase their artwork in an exhibition, enhancing their confidence and appreciating their efforts in learning about nature.

Expected Outcomes

- Increased Environmental Awareness Among Children: Children will gain a better understanding of the roles of insects and birds in the ecosystem and the importance of protecting them. They will learn that small actions can contribute to environmental conservation.
- Development of Creativity and Artistic Skills: Children will demonstrate improved fine motor skills and creativity through coloring and drawing activities. These activities will also help them develop self-expression skills.
- Active Participation from the Community: Parents, teachers, and community members will become more engaged in environmental conservation efforts and early childhood education. Their involvement will strengthen community awareness about the importance of protecting the environment.
- Recognition and Motivation for Students: Students will feel valued for their efforts through the exhibition and awards, which will boost their motivation to continue learning and contributing to environmental conservation.
- Long-Term Impact on Environmental Conservation: By instilling conservation values from an early age, children are expected to carry these values into the future and become agents of change in environmental protection.
