## Section 2. EVENT PROGRAMME

The World Migratory Bird Day event at PAUD (Early Childhood Education) Cut Nyak Dhien Mibo Banda Aceh City, themed "Protect Insect Protect Bird," aims to raise environmental awareness, specifically about the importance of protecting insects and birds for the ecosystem. PAUD, which stands for *Pendidikan Anak Usia Dini* (Early Childhood Education School), focuses on the development of young children, providing a critical foundation for their cognitive, social, and emotional growth. This event is also designed to encourage children's creativity through engaging educational activities, while involving the community, including parents and teachers, in a joint effort to support environmental conservation. Additionally, the event offers students an opportunity to showcase their artistic creations, enhancing their confidence and understanding of the natural world.

The event will begin with a public awareness session where the theme of World Migratory Bird Day will be introduced by teachers and environmental advocates. The session will highlight the role of insects and birds in maintaining ecological balance in a simple and engaging manner. Following this, children will participate in a coloring competition with a focus on birds and insects. This activity is intended to stimulate their creativity while visually introducing them to various species.

Next, the children will engage in a drawing competition where they can express their imagination about birds and insects. This competition is designed to help children develop fine motor skills while deepening their understanding of the natural world. The highlight of the event will be a festival showcasing the students' artwork from the coloring and drawing competitions.

This exhibition will be open to parents, teachers, and local community members, providing an opportunity to celebrate the children's hard work. Additionally, there will be a closing ceremony where all participants will make a collective pledge to protect insects and birds, followed by the distribution of certificates and small tokens of appreciation. With this comprehensive event plan, it is hoped that children will not only learn about the importance of environmental conservation but also feel actively involved and motivated to care for the nature around them.

### PAUD Animal Care Day: WMBD Protect Insects, Protect Birds Banda Aceh, 12 October 2024

On October 12, 2024, PAUD Cut Nyak Dhien Mibo in Banda Aceh City hosted a World Migratory Bird Day (WMBD) celebration under the theme "Protect Insects, Protect Birds." Organized by the Family Welfare Development (PKK) of Mibo Banda Aceh and supported by the EAAFP World Migratory Bird Day Small Grant, this event aimed to raise environmental awareness among young children, parents, teachers, and local community members. A total of 46 participants attended, including 20 students from PAUD Cut Nyak Dhien, 6 teachers, and 20 parents and community members.

The event began with an engaging public awareness session, led by teachers and environmental advocates, introducing the theme and purpose of World Migratory Bird Day to the participants. The session highlighted the essential roles of insects and birds in maintaining ecosystem health and stability, teaching the children how these small creatures contribute to pollination, pest control, and overall biodiversity. Presented in a simple and interactive way, the session aimed to instill an early appreciation for environmental conservation in the children and a deeper understanding of nature among all participants.

Following the introduction, the children took part in a lively coloring competition focused on birds and insects. With guidance from their teachers, the children explored the characteristics of various species, selecting colors to bring each one to life on paper. This activity encouraged the children's creativity while enhancing their fine motor skills and ability to observe details in the natural world.

The event then transitioned to a drawing competition that encouraged the young participants to illustrate birds and insects within their natural habitats. This hands-on activity helped the children develop an appreciation for nature and served as an introduction to species diversity and ecosystem interconnections. Parents, teachers, and community members observed the children as they expressed their artistic visions, creating a warm environment that fostered community support for the event's educational goals.

One of the event's highlights was an exhibition showcasing the children's artwork from the coloring and drawing competitions. The exhibition was open to parents, teachers, and community members, providing a celebratory atmosphere where the children's creative efforts were appreciated by all. This platform allowed children to feel proud of their work, boosting their confidence and reinforcing their connection with nature.
