Section 2. EVENT PROGRAMME (Compulsory)

To commemorate **World Migratory Bird Day (WMBD) 2025**, a community outreach program titled **“Shared Spaces: Birds, Kids, and Our Coastal Home in Tandung”** was successfully conducted at *Madrasah Ibtidaiyah Swasta (MIS) BPI Kampung Baru*, located in Tandung Village, Tinambung District, Polewali Mandar Regency, West Sulawesi, Indonesia, on **Saturday, 10 May 2025**. This initiative aligns with the global WMBD theme: **“Shared Spaces: Creating Bird-Friendly Cities and Communities,”** and was fully supported by the **EAAFP World Migratory Bird Day Small Grant Fund 2025**, based in Incheon, South Korea.

The program was officially opened by **Dr. Nur Aisyah Humairah, S.Si., M.Pd., Vice Dean I of Fakultas Keguruan dan Ilmu Pendidikan (FKIP), Universitas Sulawesi Barat**, and warmly welcomed by **Ms. Santaliah, S.Pd.I., Head of MIS BPI Kampung Baru**. The event engaged the entire school community, including students, teachers, and parents, in an enriching, interactive experience that combined education, conservation, and community service.

Alexander Kurniawan Sariyanto Putera, S.Si., M.Si., an ornithologist and lecturer at Universitas Sulawesi Barat, served as the project leader, supported by **nine dedicated volunteer lecturers** from the university's *Unit Penelitian dan Pengabdian kepada Masyarakat (UPPM), Fakultas Keguruan dan Ilmu Pendidikan*. They were 1) Andi Rosman N., S.Si., M.Si. 2) Dita Mulyana Ramadhani, S.Pd., M.Pd., 3) Haryanti Putri Rizal, S.Pd., M.Pd., 4) Isdaryanti, S.Si., M.Si., 5) Ketrin R. Manullang, S.Pd., S.Kom., M.Pd., 6) Meili Yanti, S.Pd., M.Pd., 7) Muh. Inayah A.M., S.Pd., M.Pd., 8) Musrifah Tahar, S.Si., M.Si., and 9) Ummu Kalsum, S.Si., M.Si. Together, they designed and implemented a multifaceted program aimed at introducing elementary students to the importance of migratory bird conservation and environmental stewardship.

Event Programme Overview:

1. **Opening Ceremony and Remarks**

 - Remarks from FKIP Vice Dean I
 - Introduction of WMBD and the project agenda
2. **Birdwatching and Outdoor Learning Activities**
 - Guided observation of migratory birds in coastal habitats
 - Species identification sessions (e.g., Pied Stilt, Red-necked Stint)
 - Distribution of illustrated booklets about migratory birds of Tandung
3. **Environmental Awareness and Clean-Up Campaign**
 - Students participated in litter collection around the school
 - Lessons on the importance of waste management for ecosystems
4. **Creative Engagement: Coloring & Storytelling Competition**



- Activities designed to reinforce learning through art and narrative
- Rewards provided to enthusiastic participants
- 5. Discussion and Reflection**
 - Interactive session on “Why Sharing Space with Birds Matters”
 - Sharing session with students and teachers on environmental roles
- 6. Distribution of Educational and Practical Materials**
 - Posters translated into Bahasa Indonesia
 - Booklets on local migratory bird species
 - Cleaning supplies to support continued environmental efforts

The program successfully met its objectives by introducing young students to the concepts of biodiversity and bird conservation, while simultaneously encouraging eco-friendly habits such as proper waste disposal. Feedback from the school community was overwhelmingly positive, with students expressing joy and curiosity throughout the day.

By blending **science education**, **local knowledge**, and **participatory action**, this WMBD 2025 initiative fostered a deeper appreciation of the natural world among the youth of Tandung and laid the foundation for ongoing conservation awareness at the grassroots level.

2025. The event successfully delivered environmental education, practical conservation actions, and strengthened local awareness of migratory bird protection.

On **Saturday, May 10, 2025**, a vibrant educational celebration took place at **Madrasah Ibtidaiyah Swasta (MIS) BPI Kampung Baru**, located in **Tandung Village, Tinambung District, Polewali Mandar Regency, West Sulawesi, Indonesia**. This event was organized in celebration of **World Migratory Bird Day (WMBD) 2025**, embracing this year’s global theme: **“Shared Spaces: Creating Bird-Friendly Cities and Communities.”**

The activity, titled **“Shared Spaces: Birds, Kids, and Our Coastal Home in Tandung”**, was led by **Alexander Kurniawan Sariyanto Putera, S.Si., M.Si.**, an ornithologist and researcher at Universitas Sulawesi Barat. The program was implemented in collaboration with **Unit Penelitian dan Pengabdian kepada Masyarakat (UPPM), Fakultas Keguruan dan Ilmu Pendidikan (FKIP), Universitas Sulawesi Barat (Unsulbar)**, and supported by the **EAAFP World Migratory Bird Day Small Grant Fund 2025**, based in Incheon, South Korea.

The event brought together a total of 70 participants, including 28 school students, 6 teachers, 15 parents, 5 university students, 1 researcher, 1 scientist, 2 birdwatchers, 1 village head (Kepala Dusun), 1 vice dean, 1 school principal, and 9 volunteer lecturers. The nine dedicated volunteer lecturers were 1) Andi Rosman N., S.Si., M.Si. 2) Dita Mulyana Ramadhani, S.Pd., M.Pd., 3) Haryanti Putri Rizal, S.Pd., M.Pd., 4) Isdaryanti, S.Si., M.Si., 5) Ketrin R. Manullang, S.Pd., S.Kom., M.Pd., 6) Meili Yanti, S.Pd., M.Pd., 7) Muh. Inayah A.M., S.Pd., M.Pd., 8) Musrifah Tahar, S.Si., M.Si., dan 9) Ummu Kalsum, S.Si., M.Si. These diverse groups reflected the collaborative spirit of the initiative, uniting education, science, and community engagement. The primary aim was to introduce local youth to the importance of migratory bird conservation, increase awareness of the ecological value of coastal habitats, and foster environmental stewardship from an early age.

The day began with a formal **opening ceremony**, officiated by **Dr. Nur Aisyah Humairah, S.Si., M.Pd.**, Vice Dean I of FKIP Universitas Sulawesi Barat. This was followed by an **Introduction of WMBD and birdwatching session**, where students learned to identify local and migratory species, including the **Red-necked Stint (*Calidris ruficollis*)**, a Near Threatened species, and the **Pied Stilt (*Himantopus leucocephalus*)**, which is protected under Indonesian law.

Beyond observing birds, students were engaged in **environmentally clean-up activities**, fostering responsibility for keeping their surroundings litter-free. Creative activities such as **coloring competitions and storytelling** further enriched their learning experience, making conservation both fun and memorable.
