### GEF's Limited Reach

GEF does not directly fund Ramsar Convention or Convention on Migratory Species, limiting flyway-scale projects.

### Institutional Disconnect

Lack of direct engagement in GEF project planning and alignment with EAAFP Strategic Plan.
